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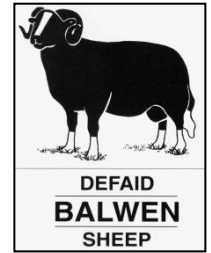
BALWEN WELSH MOUNTAIN SHEEP SOCIETY

Official Society show and sale, the society show and sale took place at Monmouthshire Livestock Centre 19th September. Our judges Mr Ken Jones, Helidon flock. Junior Judges Master Will Rees and Miss Cadi-Haf Rees, Erw-Wastad flock picked through some very strong classes to place Lowri and Alun Davies champion with there aged ewe with Will Thomas in reserve with his ram lamb.

The sale saw some roaring trade with reserve champion ram lam selling to Carri Haf Harries for 1250gns and a new breed record for a ram lamb. We think a shearling ewe record may have been set at 800gns for a ewe from Zavhia Paewai Jones which sold to Judge Ken Jones. If anyone can shed any light on previous breed records please do drop me an email.

Id like all the society to extend a large thank you to Paul Hancox for his very generous donation of a shepherds crook with a Balwen head sculpted on it. This went on to sell for £460 to John Evans. Thank you to Lyndon Trumper and his team at J Straker Chadwick for auctioning the stick and for the work they do on sale day and in the run up to it.

Membership renewals, I need to remind our members that our membership renewal is due on the 1st January each year we know that Christmas is often an expensive time so we allow for renewals to take place until the 31st March. We are only a small society and it is important for the running of the society that memberships are paid on time. For members that are attending the Royal Welsh Show you must be a fully signed up member by the 1st April to be eligible to attend the show, this rule will be strictly enforced in 2027 due to the competition now of getting pens it has been agreed at committee that it is not fair for late payers to be left on the list. If you have any questions on your membership please contact Mair or myself to assist you with how to renew.

Inspections, below is a list of the remaining inspections and who to contact to book your sheep in. it was agreed at the AGM in 2026 that ram lambs can now be inspected at the June inspection in the year following birth. It was the rule that they always had to be inspected by the 31st December in their year of birth.

I must remind you all NOT to present sheep with ORF or C.O.D.D these are infectious disease and it is not fair on your inspectors or other breeders to do so. Also please do not bring sheep to any inspection with dirty feet. All inspectors have the option to refuse to inspect sheep if any of the above are an issue. Any animal presented at inspection without an EID tag installed will also be refused.

For our newer members please ensure you have ALL your information with you we need dam and sire information for all animals to be registered at the point of registration. These are the Balwen numbers from the white ear tags not the UK numbers. **Without this information we cannot register any animals.** There is a blank form available laid out to best suit the people on inspection day to complete the paper work as easily and efficiently as possible. This is the best way to prevent mistakes and problems. We request a copy of this form be left with the society. Please email me to request a copy of this.

You also need your tags these are rototags available from Daltons Tags. You need have them printed on the female side only, to include your UK number and animal number along with your flock prefix.

It helps immensely when booking in for inspections if you could give us a number of lambs you intend to bring and book in at least two days before inspections.

I am happy to talk through any questions about registrations that members may have especially our newer members I know it can be daunting to go to your first registration.

Royal Welsh Show, this years Royal Welsh show was masked with disappointment and really poor performance of the RWAS entry system. This left many regulars out of the show as they were unable to gain a place at the show. An email refusing sponsorship at the Winter Fair on the grounds of the poor performance of their system and there being so many empty pens in the sheds from sheep not forwards seemed to hit the spot with society but as they dropped at Gwynne Davies door I feel we will get no further with any complaints we make. I have personally spoken to Gwynne and explained that email was not directed at himself or Lynda as they work hard and do an excellent job all with out pay. Gwynne told me that he had managed to get more Balwen entries off the wait list than any other breed.

Our gathering on Monday night was extremely well supported despite us not having so many regular attendees as normal and we ran out of food in record quick time. It as enjoyable evening.

Champion of the section was Zavhia Paewai Jones with Lowri and Alun Davies standing reserve champion and winning the group of three.

Melton Mowbray Show and Sale, this years section in the Melton Mowbray show and sale was kindly judged by Mr Jason Whybrow, an excellent shearling ram from Jordan Stone was champion with Lyn Arrowsmith taking reserve champion.

Trade was again this year sticky through out the sale with many breeds not selling or failing to meet upsets. I would be interested in hearing the views of members on this section at this sale we have been back at the Melton sale with a Balwen section for three years now of which I have sponsored two of those three. It is getting more expensive for us to run a section there with entry fees going up also this added to a very poor clearance rate will make it likely we need to pull the section at this sale which is a shame as many new keepers have come in the last three years from this sale. It is however an excellent site for a registration in England that is proving to be very popular. Would another multi breed sale in the Midlands be more suitable?

Thank you to all our members who have taken their sheep out this summer to promote our breed and well done to all of you that have had success in the show ring.
